



Administration

- Achieved balanced budget, continuing to operate "in the black" at year's end

Volunteers add value to Ranchers' quality of life

Volunteers are the lifeblood of Rainbow Acres! In 2017, 463 volunteers donated 11,466 hours, bringing value to every area of operations. Groups from 17 churches helped with projects. Students from Northern Arizona University/Phoenix conducted Occupational and Speech Therapy activities to help the Ranchers improve their skills. One OT group assisted Ranchers with opening the new Gift Shop in the Daehler Building. On their first day, they served over 40 shoppers and made \$1,823 in sales! WAY TO GO!

Admissions


- Continued to streamline the prospective Rancher review/admissions process
- Welcomed 5 new Ranchers and conducted 49 tours for prospective Ranchers
- Developed a new 7-day visit plan for prospective Ranchers and their families

Health & Wellness

- Provided Ranchers with 1,985 on-ranch appointments with nursing staff
- Completed house calls, vaccinations, lab work and x-rays (through mobile lab)
- Transported Ranchers to 1,424 off-ranch medical appointments

Programs

- Continued to provide valuable crew experiences and afternoon activities
- In 2017, Ranchers were engaged for 18,200 hours in the Learning Center
- Researched Project Discovery as new vocational training program for 2018



Ranchers' horizons expand through Saturday field trips

There were more opportunities than ever for Rancher activities in 2017 with outstanding one-day field trips hosted by Rainbow staff Rodolfo Martinez, Lisa Page and Andy Rogers. These discovery trips explored Oak Creek Canyon, Grand Canyon, Montezuma's Well, and V-Bar-V, which has the largest petroglyphs in Arizona. Also, the Hiking Club took Ranchers on excursions to a wide range of scenic trails across northern and central Arizona.

Quick Facts

- In 2017, Rainbow Acres served 103 Ranchers hailing from 21 U.S. states
- Rainbow Acres recently completed \$18.5 million in capital investments, the culmination of a long-term Master Site Development Plan
- Ranchers provided hundreds of hours of volunteer service at the Verde Valley Humane Society, Havens Nursing Home and Bread of Life
- ➤ Spiritual activities generated high levels of participation on and off the ranch, with over 70 Ranchers/caregivers attending local churches
- Rainbow Acres remains the only EAGLE Accredited social service agency in Arizona, a quality standard administered by the United Methodist Association of Health and Welfare Ministries



With sportsmanship, Ranchers win medals at Special Olympics

In 2017, Special Olympics enjoyed a high level of participation, with Ranchers competing in bocce ball, track and field, and basketball – and winning dozens of medals in regional and state competitions. In 2017, Rainbow Acres hosted the Regional Bocce Tournament for the Mountain Area Region at the Camp Verde home of the Roughtons, whose daughter Stephanie lives at Rainbow Acres. The Rainbow community comes together every September to support this regional competition.



Paintbrush Park gets underway as latest campus improvement

During Family & Friends Weekend, Rainbow held a groundbreaking ceremony for Paintbrush Park, a memorial dedicated to long-time friend Betty Malicki, whose son Jeff lives at Rainbow Acres. The park will be adjacent to the apartment buildings and near the agricultural area (greenhouses and barn). Work got underway in 2017, focusing on the retaining wall, sidewalks and hardscape. Once completed in 2018, the new park will be a nice addition to the ranch's amenities!
