RANCHERS SHINE

AT THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS TORCH RUN

The vibrant community of Sedona, Arizona, recently hosted a thrilling and heartwarming event—the Law Enforcement Torch Run (LETR) for the Special Olympics. This year’s event, held at Cultural Park in Sedona, saw an incredible turnout.

LETR for Special Olympics serves as the organization’s largest public awareness vehicle and fundraiser. Known as Guardians of the Flame, law enforcement members and Special Olympics athletes carry the Flame of Hope into the Opening

Ceremonies of local competitions and into Special Olympics state, provincial, national, regional, and World Games.

This year’s event was particularly notable as it adopted a more visible format, focusing on shorter distances but greater involvement across multiple agencies. This change ensured broader participation and allowed the community to engage more deeply with the athletes.

Through partnerships like the one between LETR and the Special Olympics, athletes are given opportunities to empower and transform not only themselves but also their communities and the world at large.

Local law enforcement works year-round to fundraise, helping to provide the Ranchers and other Special Olympic athletes with the resources they need to compete. It costs \$500 per athlete to compete in sporting events for a year, a small price for invaluable experiences.

The LETR included members from 12 police and fire agencies across Northern Arizona joining forces with the Ranchers, along with the Sedona Red Rockers Unified Athletes and the Verde Valley Mountain Region Unified Athletes, amongst whom our Ranchers stood proudly.

The Ranchers' involvement in this event is not just about participation—it is a profound demonstration of their capabilities, determination, and the joy they derive from being part of a community that cherishes inclusivity. These athletes, along with their peers, carried the Flame of Hope, symbolizing courage and the celebration of diversity that unites communities worldwide.



RAINBOW SHUTTLE

EMPOWERING INDEPENDENCE

Rainbow Acres has long been a home where individuals with diverse abilities find support, belonging, and opportunities to thrive. Among the many initiatives aimed at fostering independence and community engagement, the Rainbow Shuttle stands out as a pathway to empowerment, connecting Ranchers with the vibrant life beyond the ranch's borders.

A ROAD TO INDEPENDENCE

The Rainbow Shuttle isn't just a transportation service; it's a testament to the unwavering dedication and vision of the Rainbow Acres community. This program officially launched at the end of November 2023, marking a significant milestone in the journey towards independence for Ranchers.

Spearheaded by Naomi Gray, a caregiver at Rainbow Acres who seeks out strategies and initiatives that help drive independence, alongside other dedicated staff, the Rainbow Shuttle represents a collaborative effort to realize the aspirations of the Ranchers.

EMPOWERING RANCHERS, ONE RIDE AT A TIME

The Rainbow Shuttle is a carefully curated program open to Ranchers who demonstrate essential skills, such as time management, problem-solving, and money management. Resident Care Coordinators work alongside the Ranchers to prepare them for this monthly opportunity to embark on adventures within the town of Camp Verde.



EXPLORING BOUNDLESS OPPORTUNITIES

The Ranchers are given a route and schedule to various drop-off and pick-up points strategically placed around town. These points offer a mix of free activities and opportunities for shopping and dining. From the serene surroundings of the public library and local parks to the shops and museums of downtown Camp Verde, Ranchers have the chance to immerse themselves in the richness of their community.
