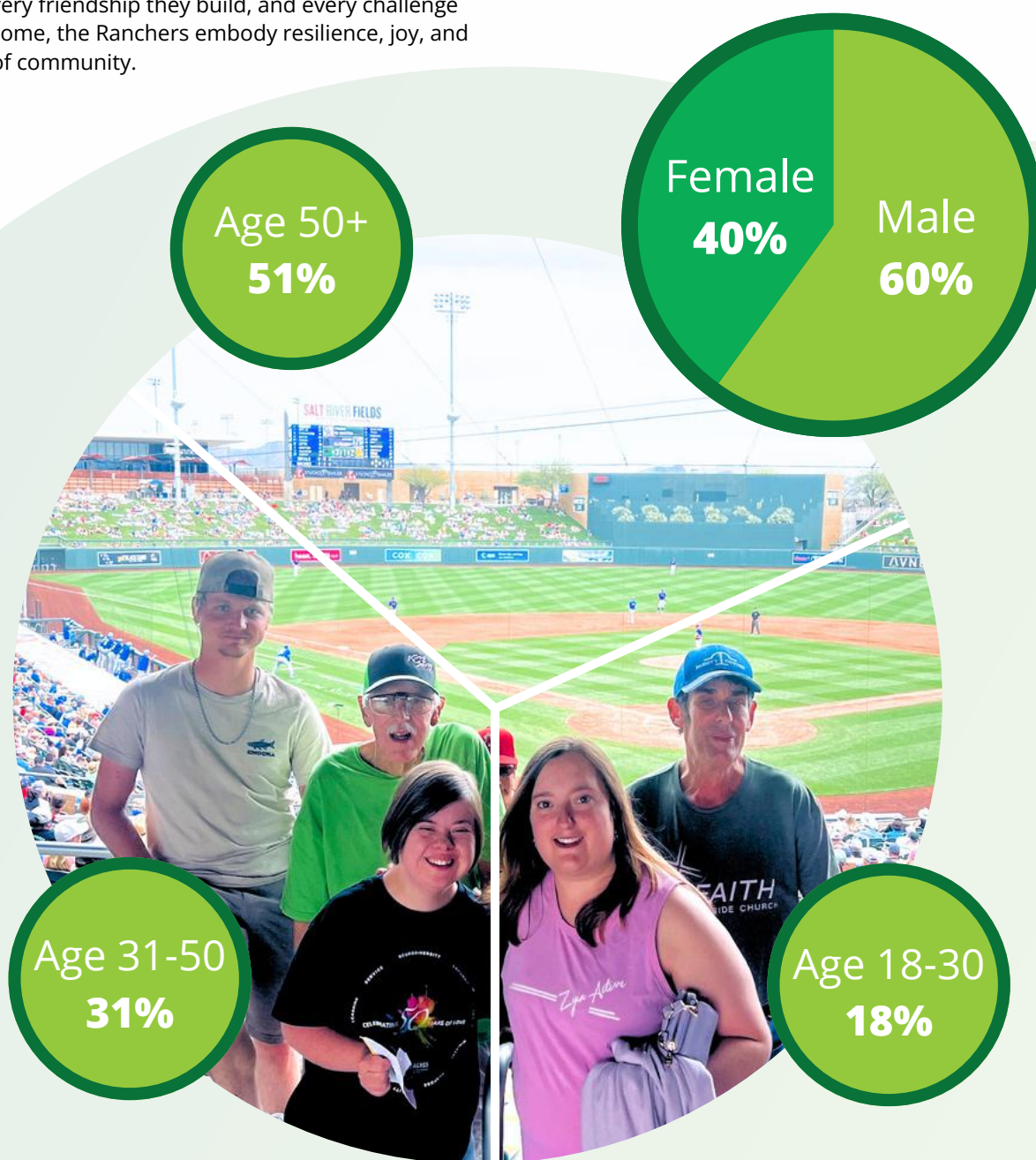


RANCHERS

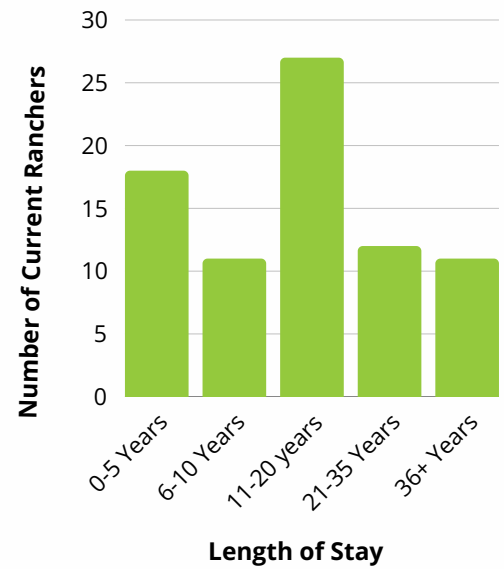

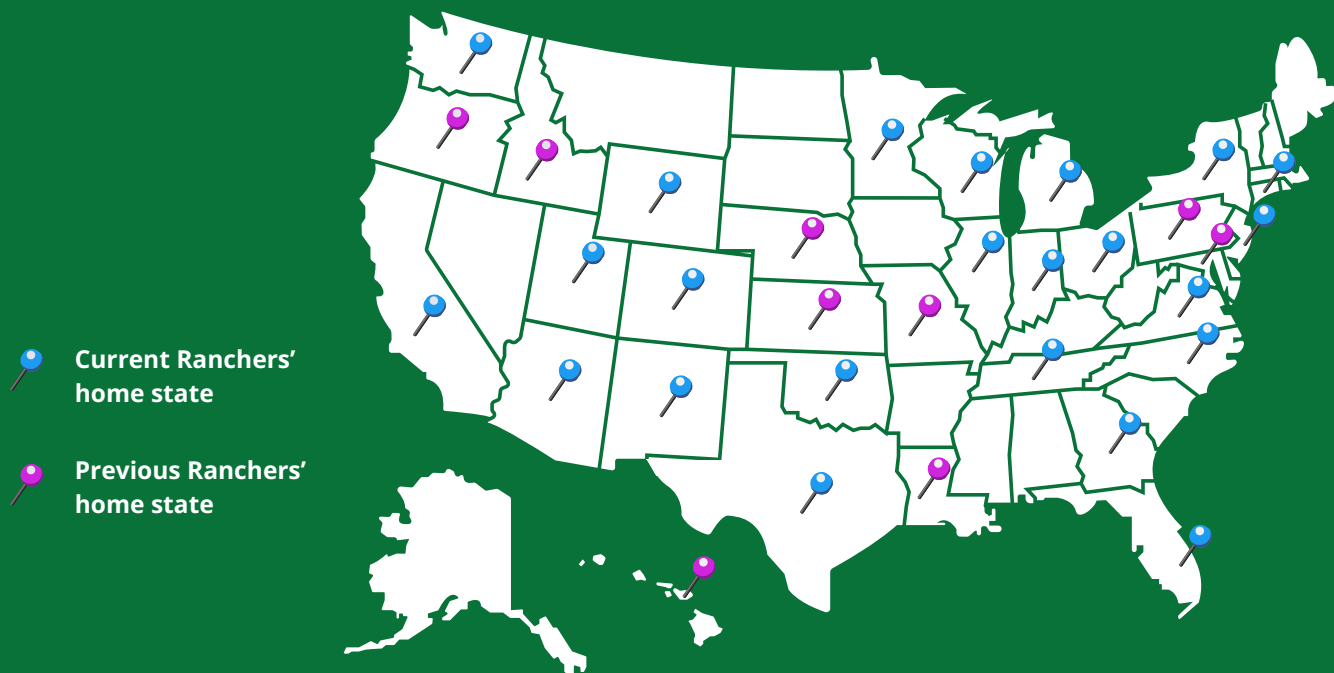


RANCHER LENGTH OF STAY

ENRICHING PROGRAMS FOR EVERY RANCHER

EMPOWERING GROWTH WITH EVERY CLASS

In 2024, Rainbow Acres continued its commitment to providing meaningful opportunities for learning, connection, and personal growth through our Rainbow Academy. Our dedicated Programs team worked diligently to enhance and expand initiatives that empowered Ranchers to develop essential skills and explore new passions.

Music remained an integral part of life at Rainbow Acres, and the Rainbow Ambassador choir performed at churches and organizations across Arizona. To further enrich our music offerings, we introduced additional music classes and brought back the beloved Clavinova sessions, providing Ranchers with even more avenues for creative expression and joy.

Life skills remained a key focus of our programs, and we expanded class offerings to support Ranchers in developing greater independence. From cooking and budgeting to guitar and daily living skills, these hands-on classes helped build confidence and self-sufficiency in a supportive environment.



Beyond life skills, we also created new clubs based on Rancher interests, offering opportunities for self-expression, creativity, and social engagement. In 2024, Ranchers participated in clubs dedicated to scrapbooking, bike riding, knitting, language learning, and more—each designed to foster friendship, fun, and a strong sense of belonging.

Every program in 2024 was intentionally designed to keep Ranchers engaged, learning, and progressing toward their personal goals. By focusing on skill development, social interaction, and self-discovery, our Programs team ensured that each Rancher's journey was fulfilling, empowering, and filled with moments of meaning.

IN THE COMMUNITY

FOSTERING AN INCLUSIVE SOCIETY

In 2024, Rainbow Acres continued to foster strong connections within the local community, providing the Ranchers with meaningful opportunities to engage, contribute, and experience new adventures. Whether through volunteer work, special outings, or partnerships with local organizations, these experiences enrich the lives of the Ranchers while also allowing them to share their talents and joy with others. From participating in community events to lending a helping hand at local businesses, each interaction strengthens our bonds and reinforces the spirit of inclusion and belonging that defines Rainbow Acres.

- 12 Ranchers volunteered at the Bread of Life food bank biweekly
- 16 Ranchers are employed within the community (+6.67% from 2023)
- 9 Ranchers partnered with the Salvation Army at Christmas to help fundraise through bell ringing at local grocery stores
- 1 Rancher volunteered at a local nursing home
- 62 Ranchers showcased practical art pieces at libraries and the Verde Valley Fair
- 11 performances were given by the choir at various venues



SPECIAL OLYMPICS

Rainbow Acres Ranchers participated in multiple Special Olympics events in 2024, including the Law Enforcement Torch Run (LETR) in Sedona. LETR, a major awareness and fundraising event, saw Ranchers run alongside law enforcement officers, carrying the Flame of Hope into competitions.

Ranchers also competed in bocce, track and field, basketball, and softball, demonstrating teamwork and determination. They strategized in bocce, pushed their limits in track events, played with resilience in basketball, and showcased confidence on the softball field. Their participation reflected their commitment to growth, competition, and community.



HEALTH & WELLNESS

ENCOURAGING HEALTH IN ALL ASPECTS OF LIFE

At Rainbow Acres, we are deeply committed to providing comprehensive health and wellness services for our Ranchers, ensuring they receive the care and support they need to live healthy, fulfilling lives. In 2024, we've taken significant strides in improving access to healthcare and enhancing the overall wellness of the Ranchers, making it a year of positive change and growth in this critical area.



PODIATRY AND LAB SERVICES

In addition to our primary care, we've continued to prioritize specialized healthcare needs. Podiatry services are offered every ten weeks, addressing the unique foot care needs of the Ranchers. Regular podiatric care helps prevent potential mobility issues and enhances the Ranchers' quality of life.

Additionally, we have a lab service on-site every other Tuesday, providing easy access to essential tests and screenings. This service is an integral part of our preventative care strategy, allowing for early detection and more proactive health management.

MEDICATIONS AND SAFETY ZERO ERRORS

A significant achievement in March of 2024 was the introduction of a medication scanning system. This advanced technology allows us to scan all medications for the Ranchers, ensuring accuracy and safety. Since implementing the scanning system, we are proud to report that there have been zero medication errors—a monumental success that underscores our commitment to health and safety.

MEDICATION DELIVERY AND ADMISSION SUPPORT

Health & Wellness also plays an essential role in supporting the Ranchers' medication needs. We have established a monthly Medication Cycle Fill Delivery, ensuring that medications are consistently available when needed. Additionally, medication changes and new orders are delivered daily. These processes ensure that Ranchers receive the correct medications at the right time, improving health outcomes.

As part of our holistic approach, Health & Wellness also plays a vital role on the admission committee, ensuring that new Ranchers receive the personalized care and attention they need from day one. By being involved in the admission process, we are able to prioritize the health and wellness needs of each individual, ensuring a smooth transition into our community.

ON-SITE PRIMARY CARE PROVIDER

One of the most impactful developments in 2024 has been the addition of a Primary Care Provider (PCP) who is now on-site every three weeks. This convenient and consistent access to primary care ensures that the Ranchers' health needs are addressed quickly and effectively. By having a PCP on-site, we've been able to reduce the stress and barriers often associated with healthcare appointments, providing timely interventions and fostering long-term health relationships.

COUNSELING SERVICES

Mental and emotional well-being is just as important as physical health, which is why we continue to offer counseling services on-site every Wednesday and Thursday. Our counseling team is dedicated to helping the Ranchers navigate life's challenges, offering a safe space for them to discuss their feelings and mental health concerns. With consistent support, the Ranchers are empowered to lead more balanced and healthy lives.

STAYING ACTIVE

At Rainbow Acres, our fitness program promotes health, confidence, and connection through engaging activities tailored to all abilities. Ranchers enjoy group exercises, Zumba, strength training, and cardio workouts, fostering both physical and social well-being. The on-ranch fitness center offers accessible equipment, empowering Ranchers to build strength, improve mobility, and develop lifelong healthy habits in a supportive environment.

LOOKING AHEAD

In 2024, we made great strides in our health and wellness initiatives, and we remain committed to continuously improving the care we provide. With ongoing efforts in primary care, specialized services, medication management, mental health support, and fitness programs, we will continue to enhance the lives of the Ranchers. MILESTONES OF CHANGE

MAKING A DIFFERENCE ONE PROJECT AT A TIME

In 2024, the Rainbow Acres Buildings and Grounds team, along with dedicated volunteers, worked tirelessly to enhance and maintain our facilities, ensuring a safe, functional, and welcoming environment for the Ranchers. Their hard work brought major improvements across campus, from the complete rehab of Evergreen House to critical propane appliance replacements and extensive roofing repairs.

They also completed important hardscaping projects, upgraded cabinetry for better medication distribution, and played a key role in supporting the Obodo solar project. Thanks to their efforts, Rainbow Acres continues to be a place of comfort, care, and sustainability for all who call it home.

Projects completed in 2024:

- Evergreen House rehab
- Propane appliance replacements:
 - Evergreen stove and dryer
 - Hoover stove, dryer, and two hot water heaters
 - Koinonia stove
 - Baldwin stove, dryer, and a hot water heater
- Installed additional cabinetry in seven residences to support prescription medication distribution
- Completed Memory Walk, Frese House, Dakin Basin, & road to the Barn hardscape
- Supported the Obodo solar project installation:
 - 9 electric meters
 - 12 roof structures
- Replaced the Water Treatment Arsenic Media
- Installed a swing set and terracing at the Daehler courtyard
- Completed all roof repairs involved with the HVAC heat pump conversions
- Replaced administrative building porch
- Painted Hoover house
- Moved & renovated the administrative kitchen & copier area





SOLAR PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

INCREASING ENERGY AND REDUCING OUR CARBON FOOTPRINT

One of the most exciting milestones for Rainbow Acres in 2024 is the long-awaited completion of our Solar Project. This ambitious initiative has been in the works for several years, and with the introduction of new policies that support sustainable energy, we were thrilled when our board gave the final approval to move forward with the project this year.

We partnered with Obodo Energy, a leading provider in solar solutions, to help us bring this vision to life. The project involves the installation of solar panels across multiple locations on the property, marking a major step toward energy independence for Rainbow Acres.

The installation process began with the placement of solar panels on the roofs of our buildings, which were designed to harness the power of the sun and reduce our reliance on external power sources. To maximize the energy capture, steel frames were constructed above two of our parking lots, creating the perfect space for additional panels. This will further increase our solar capacity and ensure that we are making the most of the available space.

We are proud to announce that some of the panels are already up and running, providing us with clean, renewable energy. However, the project is not yet complete, and we are eagerly anticipating the full activation of the remaining panels in 2025. Once fully operational, the Solar Project will not only reduce our carbon footprint but also allow us to reinvest those savings back into our programs and services for the Ranchers.

This project reflects our commitment to sustainability, innovation, and a greener future. We are excited to see how it will continue to evolve and benefit the Rainbow Acres community for years to come.

LEAVING A LEGACY OF LOVE

In 2002, our plan was to keep our then 27-year-old daughter, Stephanie, at home with us until we retired sometime in the distant future. At that time, we would begin the process of finding a place for her to live. But God had other plans.....

We were vacationing at an RV Resort in 2002. Our good friends, who frequently traveled with us, had to cancel their plans at the last minute. That left the campsite next to ours vacant. Not long after our arrival, a motor coach backed into that spot. It wasn't long before Stephanie met our new neighbors, John and Mary Chandler, who would impact the course of our future.

In their earlier years, the Chandlers formed a relationship with Ralph Showers, the Founder of Rainbow Acres, and with a group from their church, committed to supporting the Ranch financially, emotionally, and practically through biannual mission trips. This group from Hillside Church spent years helping build and maintain the Ranch while fostering meaningful relationships with the Ranchers and staff.

The morning we were scheduled to leave the RV Resort, Mary came to our trailer and said, "I hope I don't offend you, but I have something I'd like to share with you." She invited us over to their coach to see a video of a place they were involved with and thought we might find interesting. Mary showed us a video taken on a recent trip to Rainbow Acres. They told us about their trips to Rainbow that happened every April and October and invited us to come with them, which we did the next April.

We made each trip with the Hillside Group from April 2003 through October 2008. In September of 2008, God opened the door for us to move Stephanie to her new home at Rainbow Acres.

After several years of seeing the life-changing difference Stephanie was experiencing living at Rainbow, we wanted to have a part in ensuring the future of Rainbow for Stephanie and for so many others over the decades. Becoming a member of the Legacy of Love Society has given us the opportunity to add our resources to help fulfill that goal.

PLANNED GIVING OPTIONS

LEAVE A LEGACY OF LOVE

Leaving a legacy through planned giving to Rainbow Acres is a wonderful way to support our mission and ensure our sustainability for years to come. Here's a comprehensive guide on various planned giving options.

Before implementing any planned giving strategy, consult with your financial advisor, attorney, or tax professional to ensure it aligns with your overall estate plan and financial goals. They can provide personalized guidance based on your individual circumstances and help you maximize the impact of your legacy gift to Rainbow Acres.

BEQUEST

Include Rainbow Acres in your will or trust, designating a specific amount, asset, or percentage of your estate. You can direct your gift toward general use or a specific program.

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY (CGA)

Donate assets in exchange for fixed lifetime payments, with potential tax deductions and capital gains savings.

CHARITABLE IRA GIFTS

If you're 70½ or older, make tax-free distributions (QCDs) from your IRA to Rainbow Acres, reducing taxable income while fulfilling your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).

DONOR ADVISED FUND

Recommend grants from your DAF to support Rainbow Acres, specifying fund usage if desired.

LIFE INSURANCE

Name Rainbow Acres as a beneficiary or transfer ownership of a policy for potential tax benefits.

REAL ESTATE

Gift real estate to Rainbow Acres and receive a charitable deduction while potentially avoiding capital gains taxes.

APPRECIATED STOCK & SECURITIES

Donate appreciated stocks to avoid capital gains taxes and receive a deduction for the fair market value.

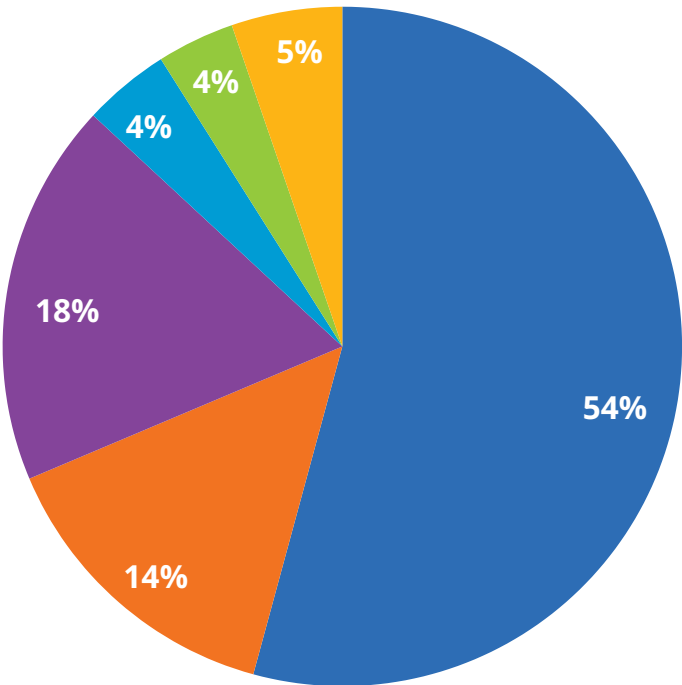

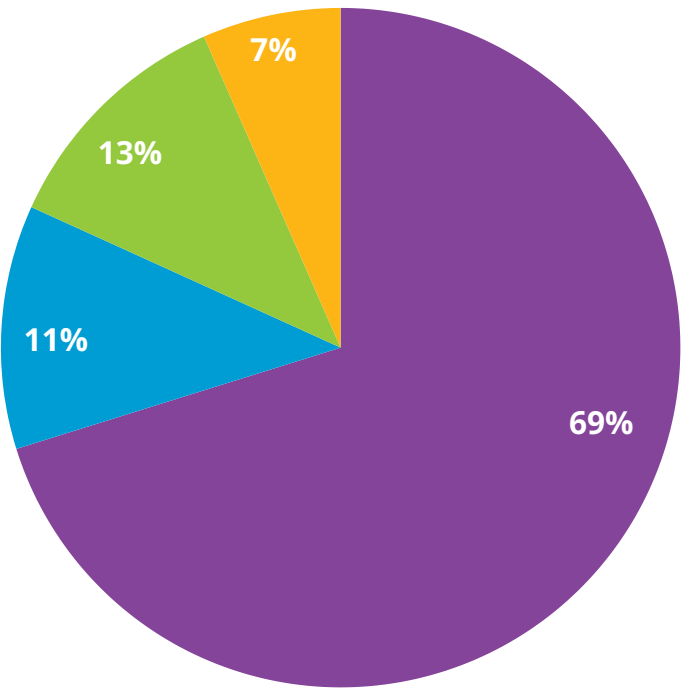

ARIZONA CHARITABLE TAX CREDIT

Take advantage of the Arizona Charitable Tax Credit and receive money back on your Arizona state tax refund. If you have a tax liability in Arizona, you could receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit when you donate to Rainbow Acres. It's like telling the government how to spend your tax dollars.

Your tax credit for donating to Rainbow Acres as a Qualifying Charitable Organization (QCO) is separate from other tax credits, such as the Public School Tax Credit or the Foster Care Charitable Organizations. This credit can be used alongside other tax credits for even more savings on your taxes.*

Donate to Rainbow Acres through the mail, over the phone, or online. Then, file the AZ Form 321 with your tax documents to claim the AZ Charitable Tax Credit. Reduce the amount you owe to the State of Arizona and receive a dollar-for-dollar credit on your AZ tax return.*

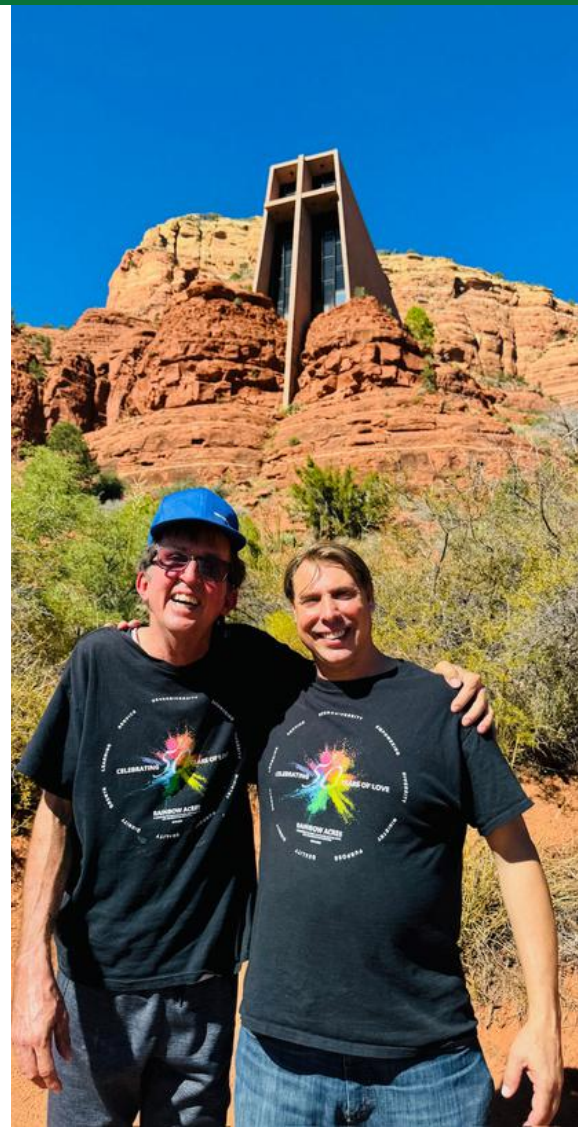
